

At your disposal! How to dispose of your waste.



Food waste

Things left over during or after cooking. Put in a food waste bag and dispose of in your residential recycling room or a refuse chute designated for food waste.



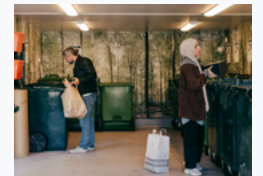
Plastic packaging

Everything plastic can be reused. Dispose of it in your residential recycling room, or at the nearest recycling station (ÅVS).



Metal packaging

Tin cans, caps and such can be disposed of in your residential recycling room, or at the nearest recycling station (ÅVS).



Packaging and newspapers

Paper packaging and newspapers can be disposed of at your residential recycling room, or at the nearest recycling station (ÅVS).



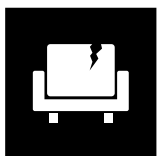
Glass packaging

Glass bottles and jars can be disposed of in your residential recycling room, or at the nearest recycling station (ÅVS).



Hazardous waste

Anything that is corrosive, flammable or dangerous for the environment must be disposed of in a "miljöstation", or at the nearest recycling centre (ÅVC). Medicines you no longer need must be given to a pharmacy.



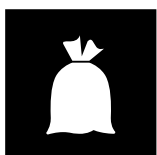
Bulky waste

Heavy or bulky things that require extra space must be disposed of at your nearest recycling centre (ÅVC).



Electrical waste

Lamps, fluorescent tubes and anything with a cord or battery is electrical waste. Dispose of this at a "miljöstation" or at a recycling centre (ÅVC).



Residual waste

Everything that does not belong to any of the waste types above, should be disposed of at your residential recycling room or a refuse chute.
